
"Rosie the Riveter," star of a government campaign aimed at recruiting female workers for the munitions industry, became perhaps the most iconic image of working women during the war.

Serpico, who was armed during the drug raid, had only been shot after briefly turning away from the suspect when he realized that the two officers who were with him did not follow, raising the question whether Serpico had actually been brought to the apartment by police to be executed.

The NY Metro Magazine published an article about Serpico titled, "Portrait of an Honest Cop." He was awarded an NYPD gold shield and promoted to detective.
